The toss of a coin decided which team, Richland or Grandview, would meet Wapato for the Yakima valley prep grid title. The decision was made at a meeting held in Richland Sunday afternoon. At a meeting held yesterday afternoon at Grandview, it was decided that the championship contest would be held Friday night at 7:30 o'clock on the Grandview gridiron.

Both Richland and Grandview wound up the season in a tie for first place, each with four wins and no defeats. The one tie game was a 7-7 deadlock played between the co-titleholders of the Southern Division.

If Grandview should defeat Wapato, Richland would share the crown with the Greyhounds. This point was decided upon before flipping the coin. If Richland had won the toss, the reverse procedure would have been in order.

Present at the meeting Sunday afternoon in Richland, were Leslie McIntosh, Columbia high school principal, Col-Hi coach, Francis Rish, Grandview principal, Charles Los and Art Smith coach.

McIntosh flipped the coin and Los called while the coin was in the air. Los said heads, and up came heads. There was a brief moment of silence when the coin was tossed and both factions were reluctant to turn their gaze on the coin. When McIntosh said, "It's heads," Principal Los broke the tenseness when he asked, "Will someone pass the adrenalin, please?"

Coach Rish was obviously disappointed but said that the situation was cleared up in the best possible way under the circumstances.

Conflicting basketball schedules at both high schools ruled out the possibility of a play-off game between the two Southern Division schools.
