

# Richland Downs Sunnyside, 19-6

SUNNYSIDE, Nov. 4. — The Richland Bombers scored two first half touchdowns then settled back to protect the lead as they defeated Sunnyside 19-6, on the Grizzlies' gridiron last night. The win gave the Bombers a tie for the Southern Division crown.

The Bombers rolled up 12 first downs to the Grizzlies' nine and 211 yards net on the ground while holding Sunnyside to 125. In the passing department, Sunnyside netted 32 yards to Richland 22.

Richland received the kickoff and marched straight down the field for their first score with fullback Jack Morrow driving over right tackle for the six points. Bill Tracy's placekick was good and the Bombers led 7-0 with only five minutes gone in the first period.

Sunnyside took the Richland kickoff on their own 25 and bulled their way to the Richland 35 where their offense bogged down when a completed pass on fourth down from Bob Hazzard to Elmer Felician failed to make the necessary yardage.

Tracy ran one play for no gain as the second half got underway then the Bomber line opened up a big hole over left tackle and Morrow broke into the clear to romp 45 yards for the second Richland TD. Tracy's kick was wide of the uprights.

Richland kicked off to Sunnyside, Doug Leifeste returning from the 12 to his own 38. In three plays the Grizzlies netted one yard and Sunnyside punted to Tracy on the Richland 15, the Bomber back running the ball back to the 37. Two line plays picked up three yards and a pass from Tracy to Skipper Scott fell incomplete. Tracy punted to the Grizzly 23, Bob Saylor returning to his 46.

After gaining one yard Leifeste dropped back to pass and was dropped for a 15 yard loss by Clarence Fuicher, Bomber guard. Saylor's punt went out of bounds on the Richland 21.

The Bombers penetrated to the Grizzly 49 then punted, Roy Kelley, Sunnyside quarterback, being dropped on his own 29-yard line. The Grizzlies racked up three first downs shortly before the half ended. A 25-yard jaunt by Saylor and an 18-yard aerial piled up most of the yardage. The ball was on the Richland 14 as the half ended.

Richland kicked off to Sunnyside to open the second half of play but again the Grizzlies offense was stopped and they were forced to punt. Richland took the ball on their own 45 and in 12 plays tallied another touchdown. Tracy's kick was blocked. Morrow broke away for 17 yards and a 6-yard shove from Tracy to end Jack Dawson moved the ball into scoring territory.

Felician took the kick off on the five and made a nice return to the 30 where he was hauled down from behind by Lionel Roberts, Bomber quarterback. A five-yard offside penalty against Richland and five yards

yards on a line play and two passes fell incomplete and Saylor booted to the Richland 40. Bomber coach Francis Rish sent the bench of players as Richland took over. The reserves ran up 19 yards and a first and ten as the gun sounded ending the game.

The game was played on a wet, soggy field that had become saturated from a shroud of mist that had hung over the area for the past 24 hours.

The Richland team ran, for the most part, straight plays and failed to open up with any of their scoring plays, the Bomber coach probably keeping most of the plays under wraps until the Yakima game next week.
