

Bombers Take Fourth Win At Grandview

GRANDVIEW — Fast Bomber backs, running behind a big, hard charging forward wall scored a decisive 22-0 football victory over the local Greyhounds here Friday night.

The victory continued the Richland win streak to four straight as the Bomber eleven pointed for the big non-conference test with highly-rated Walla Walla next week.

The Bombers, one of the top teams in Eastern Washington didn't score on Grandview until late in the first half. Jack Dawson clawed his way from the three and Jim Miller place-kicked the conversion. That was the first score on the Grandview team this season.

Earlier in the game three marches by the Bombers were halted by hard-fighting Greyhounds.

Dawson scored again in the third quarter, this time from about 20 yards out and Miller again converted to make it 14-0 for the visitors from the atomic city.

Grandview, getting a little desperate, threw three quick passes which netted nothing. A punt to the Richland 29 was picked up by Dawson who zigged and zagged his way to the sideline where he put his head down and

ran for the goal. Kenny Chubb threw an expert block in mid-field to make the run possible. The try for extra point failed.

After a Richland drive broke down later in the quarter, Grandview's Leo Winger attempted to run it back but was thrown behind the goal for a safety and two Richland points. The score stood at 22-0.

Grandview began to roll against Bomber reserves late in the game racking up four successive first downs. But the drive was halted before the game ended.
